To Our Community Partners,

During the most recent Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission meeting, the Commission voted and approved a 40-hour training program for members of the established Administrative Charging Committees (ACC) throughout the State. Training will cover police procedures utilizing lecture, case studies, and situational based learning. Regional classes will be conducted throughout the State. We anticipate partnering with local community colleges and/or police training facilities for the use of classroom space. Training will consist of 5 consecutive 8-hour days (Monday through Friday). ACC Members may not miss any time during this training period. We will begin scheduling training once members are identified.

We will rely on the chairperson of each Police Accountability Board (PAB) to act as a conduit for identifying the selected ACC Members requiring training. A registration link will be sent to ACC Members once identified by the PAB Chairperson in order to register for training. Confirmation will be emailed to both the PAB Chairperson and the ACC Member upon receipt.
